

The mill rate adopted on June 6, 2017 will be 50.50 mills on real estate & personal property and 37.00 mills on motor vehicles. This is the same mill rate as the FY 17 budget.

Please note that the amount of revenue from the State of CT indicated on this mailer has been estimated at FY 17 level as the state has still not adopted a budget as of the date of this mailer.


The City of New Britain's mill rate $\underline{\textbf{WITHOUT}}$ state dollars would be 88.27 mills.

Small Business Development

Over the last year, we have welcomed more than 20 new businesses and seen the creation of more than 200 new jobs. We are creating an environment where business owners want to plant their roots and thrive in an urban environment.

Whether we are getting rid of red tape or opening our minds to new ideas—New Britain is leading the way in helping business thrive. We've reorganized City Hall to make it easier for developers to get their plans under way, implemented new economic development incentive programs for businesses, and more.



Infrastructure Investments

Soon to be the gateway to New Britain our signature Beehive bridge will take form. Finally, downtown and the Broad Street business district will be a hive of activity. This welcoming pedestrian and motor vehicle passage will bring visitors from far and wide.

Connecting the Beehive bridge and CTfastrak's main terminal is part of our vision to create transit oriented development. One of the first major components is the development of Columbus Commons on the boulevard across from CTfastrak. The mix of housing and retail will certainly be an asset to this growing part of the city's master plan.

Energy and Innovation

Since launching our SMART City Initiative in 2016, we've made strides in reducing the cost of government and lessening our impact on the environment. Over the last year, we've hired a new energy and facilities manager who is working with experts in the industry to reduce our electricity costs and to explore other ways to save money.

A new fuel cell at New Britain High School is supplementing a large portion of the building's electrical and heating needs. This investment in our largest school building is part of the commitment to creating an innovative environment for our children to thrive in.

Other projects recently completed or in the works include free Wi-Fi internet downtown, parking meter upgrades, traffic light alignment, and an app that will allow residents to send a pothole or issue from their smartphone directly to our Public Works Department.

BEE a part of the Action

The New Britain Bees—members of the Atlantic League of Professional Baseball—are into their second season here in New Britain. With improvements to the stadium, which include a first rate concession provider, family friendly fun, fireworks, safe parking and a ticket price that can't be beat they are the best game in town. The talented players are earning their way to the big leagues and entertaining everyone along the way!
