

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#### **New Britain COVID-19 Report**

#### New Britain Positive COVID-19 in the Past 7 Days



As of March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, in New Britain, for the past 7 days, there were 25 positive NAAT tests, and the percent positivity (NAAT) is 5.3%. In New Britain, in the last 7 days, there were 4 positive antigen tests.

Number of cases for the past 7 days 16. New Britain's case rate is 3.2 per 100,000 residents.

COVID-19 Community Transmission in New Britain is Low.

New cases per 100,000 persons in the past 7 days: 3.2 (Low)


Percentage of positive NAATs tests during the past 7 days: 5.3% (Low)

As of February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2023, 13.35% of New Britain residents have received a COVID-19 bivalent booster.

The age group with the highest percent of individuals with a bivalent dose is 65 and older (39.8%), followed by 45-64 (18.2%), 25-44 (8.5%), 15-24 (4.2%), and 5-14 (3.1%).

# COVID-19 (Bivalent) Booster Coverage by Age Group in New Britain






During the week of 02/17/23 – 02/23/23, The Hospital of Central Connecticut (THOCC) in New Britain had a total of 13 adult COVID-19 patients hospitalized, and zero COVID-19 patients in the ICU.

The Hospital for Special Care had zero COVID-19 adult patients hospitalized, and zero in the ICU.

No pediatric patients hospitalized with COVID-19 in both hospitals.

As of March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, New Britain School District reported 1062 possible and confirmed COVID-19 cases since August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Among them, 343 (32.30%) are staff members and 719 (67.70%) are students.



# Hartford County Positive COVID-19 in the Past 7 Days



As of March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, in Hartford County, there were 209 positive PCR/NAAT tests and 113 positive antigen tests in the past 7 days. The percent positivity of PCR/NAAT tests in Hartford County is 4.52%.

According to Connecticut Department of Public Health (CT DPH), As of March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, the total of laboratory-confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases reported among Connecticut residents is 975,537; 936 have been reported in the past 7 days. Two hundred and fifty patients are currently hospitalized with laboratory-confirmed

COVID-19; of these, 78 (31.2%) are not fully vaccinated. The percent positivity in Connecticut is 5.28%.





As of March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, 53,848 valid specimen of SARS-CoV-2 sequences were reported to CT DPH. Specimen collections were between 01/12/2021 and 02/17/2023. Omicron is considered a variant of concern, representing 58.69%, being followed by variants that are being monitored, Delta (32.01%), Alpha (4.69%), and others (4.61%).

As of February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023, the omicron sub lineage of most concern is XBB.1.5, which represents 87.9% of the omicron specimen, followed by BQ.1.1 (7.1%), and XBB (2.0%).

BA.2 includes BA.2 and all sublineages except BA.2.12.1, BA.2.75, BN.1, and XBB.







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


As of March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023, CT Community Level of Hartford County is Low.

- If you are <u>at high risk for severe illness</u>, talk with a healthcare provider about additional prevention actions.


#### Cases per 100k in Hartford County

#### 7) Test to Treat Locations

DPH has partnered with four federal qualified health centers that offer no-cost COVID-19 testing and treatment including:

- Charter Oak Health Center Inc, 21 Grand St, Hartford
- Fair Haven Community Health Clinic, 374 Grand Ave, New Haven
- Family Centers Health Care, 111 Wilbur Peck Court, Greenwich
- Southwest Community Health Center, 1020 Fairfield Ave, Bridgeport

In addition to the FQHCs, the nationwide <u>Test to Treat</u> initiative provides testing for COVID-19 and treatments from a health care provider, all in one location. Connecticut currently has more than 40 Test to Treat sites, which are located at select pharmacies and urgent care centers throughout the state.
